Pharm shall extend over a period of eight semesters (four academic years) and six semesters (three academic years) for lateral entry students. The curricula and syllabi for the program shall be prescribed from time to time by Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi. <br> Medium of instruction and examination shall be in English. |
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| R. 3 | WORKING DAYS IN EACH SEMESTER <br> Each semester shall consist of not less than 100 working days. The odd semesters shall be conducted from the month of June/July to November/December and the even semesters shall be conducted from December/January to May/June in every calendar year. |

## R8.3 Sessional Exams

Two Sessional exams shall be conducted for each theory / practical course as per the schedule fixed by the college(s). The scheme of question paper for theory and practical Sessional examinations is given below. The average marks of two Sessional exams shall be computed for internal assessment as per the requirements given in tables (Annexure III).

The sessional exam shall be conducted for 30 marks for theory and shall be computed for 15 marks. The minimum passing mark for sessional examination is 8 marks. If any student fails to get the 8 marks, he/she must appear for remedial sessional examination. Similarly, the Sessional exam for practical shall be conducted for 40 marks and shall be computed for 10 marks.

| R. 15 | FAILURE IN A SUBJECT |
|  | In case a student fails to secure the minimum $50 \%$ in any Theory or Practical course as specified in R7, then he/she shall reappear for the end semester examination of that course. However, his/her marks of the Internal Assessment shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing. <br> A learner who remains absent for any end semester examination shall be assigned a letter grade of AB and a corresponding grade point of zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course. |
| R. 16 | PERFORMANCE EVALUATION (SGPA AND CGPA) |
|  | The performance of a student in a semester is indicated by a number called 'Semester Grade Point Average' (SGPA). <br> The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses by the student during the semester. For example, if a student takes five courses (Theory/Practical) in a semester with credits $\mathrm{C} 1, \mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 3, \mathrm{C} 4$ and C 5 and the student's grade points in these courses are G1, G2, G3, G4 and G5, respectively, and then students' SGPA is equal to: $\text { SGPA }=\frac{\mathbf{C}_{1} \mathbf{G}_{1}+\mathrm{C}_{2} \mathbf{G}_{2}+\mathrm{C}_{3} \mathbf{G}_{3}+\mathrm{C}_{4} \mathrm{G}_{4}+\mathrm{C}_{5} \mathbf{G}_{5}}{\mathbf{C}_{1}+\mathrm{C}_{2}+\mathrm{C}_{3}+\mathrm{C}_{4}+\mathrm{C}_{5}}$ <br> The SGPA is calculated to two decimal points. It should be noted that the SGPA for any semester shall take into consideration the F and ABS grade awarded in that semester. The CGPA shall reflect the failed status in case of F grade(s), till the course(s) is/are passed. When the course(s)is/are passed by obtaining a pass grade on subsequent examination(s) the CGPA shall only reflect the new grade and not the fail grades earned earlier.
